Our journey begins in Assisi. We will walk and pray at the same locations where St. Francis and St. Clare, and many others before us drew closer to God. While in Rome, this pilgrimage will take us to the sacred sites of our Catholic faith, including the Sistine Chapel, the Basilicas of Christian Rome. We will also take in the historic venues of ancient Rome, including the Roman Forum. We will celebrate Mass at the Church of Saint Anselm in Rome, as well as have the opportunity to attend the Holy Father's general audience.

We continue on to San Giovanni Rotondo, the home of Saint Pio of Pietrelcina. We will celebrate Mass at the tomb of Padre Pio and visit sites that mark his saintly life. We will walk in the footsteps of St. Benedict as we visit the Benedictine Abbey of Montecassino. Upon arrival in Naples, we will board our overnight cruise to Sicily for the grand finale to our pilgrimage with the celebration of Mass at Our Lady of Miracles in Alcamo, Sicily.

I hope you will join us on this exciting journey of faith through Majestic Italy. Consider this pilgrimage as a gift of yourself to God and a gift of God to you!

ITINERARY

Day 1 January 2, Friday, Depart USA

This afternoon depart New York's JFK International Airport on your overseas journey when the Alitalia intercontinental jet lifts into the evening sky on your overnight flight to Rome.

Complimentary meals and beverage will be served aloft. (D,B)

Day 2 January 3, Saturday: Arrive Rome - Assisi

Upon morning arrival at Rome's Leonardo Da Vinci Airport, go through Passport Control, claim your luggage, and a Passages Tour Manager will meet you upon your exit from Customs. Your luggage will be transferred to your bus and soon you will be on your way to Assisi, one of the high points of any travel experience. After a two and half-hour ride, you will see Assisi on a mountaintop. Arrive at St. Mary of the Angels for a visit. The Basilica was built in 1569, and is crowned by the magnificent dome designed by Alessi. It encloses the shrine of the "Porziuncola" or the Little Portion Chapel around which the first Franciscan community was centered, the place where Clare received the habit from Francis, and the Capella Del Transito, which marks the spot where the Saint died. You will see the statue of Saint Francis in the courtyard where thornless roses bloom. Check-in at hotel in Assisi. Independent lunch. Freshen up at hotel; then, **walk to the Basilica of Francis to Celebrate Mass.** After Mass, our local guide will take us to explore the Basilica complex, which is actually composed of two churches built one atop the other. Beneath both churches is the crypt that houses the tomb of St. Francis. The lower Basilica dates from 1228-1230, and is richly decorated with beautiful stained glass windows, and paintings done by some of the most important artists of the 13th & 14th centuries. In the upper Basilica, built from 1230-1253, you will marvel at the monumental frescoes painted by Giotto, which depict scenes from the life of the saint.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Assisi. (D)

Day 3 January 4, Sunday: AM/Assisi - PM/Academy of Fine Arts, Florence

After breakfast we will walk to the Basilica of St. Clare, the first and most important heroine of the Franciscan movement; view her remains and see the miraculous Crucifix. Continue to Rivotorto to **Celebrate Sunday Mass at the Sanctuary.** After Mass, we leave Assisi and drive through the gentle Umbrian and Tuscan hills that for centuries have inspired saints, artists and admirers of beauty. Upon arrival in Florence, the Renaissance city, our local guide will be ready to take you to visit the Accademia, which houses the superb "David" by Michelangelo. Independent lunch.

Check-in at hotel in Florence.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Florence. (B,D)

Day 4 January 5, Monday: Highlights of Florence - Rome

After breakfast, our local guide will be ready to take you to see the highlights of Florence: The beautiful Piazza Del Duomo and the delicately patterned

green, white and pink Cathedral of Santa Maria Del Fiore, crowned with its magnificent Dome by Brunelleschi; Giotto's Bell Tower; the Romanesque Baptistry of St. John with the exquisite bronze doors by Ghiberti, which Michelangelo called the "Gates of Paradise"; and the 13th century Franciscan Church of the Holy Cross, which houses the tombs of the greatest of Florentine men. **Celebrate Mass at the Franciscan Church of the Holy Cross.** Independent lunch. This afternoon, we leave Florence for the "Eternal City." History, evolving over 2,500 years, will be made visible for you by the Roman ruins, 15th century churches, 17th century palaces and 20th century monuments. Hotel check-in.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Rome. (B,D)

Day 5 January 6, Tuesday: (Epiphany) - Mass at St. Anselm Church - PM/Tour of Christian Rome

After breakfast, you will be transferred to **St. Anselm Church for Mass.** After Mass, we will visit the magnificent Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls, built by Constantine in the 4th century on the site of St. Paul's tomb. After having been totally destroyed by fire in 1823, it was rebuilt on the original basilican plan of early Christian churches. Surrounding the nave are the medallions of each Pope, from Peter to Benedict XVI. Continue to visit the Basilica of St. John Lateran, the cathedral and see of the Archdiocese of Rome. Like St. Peter's and St. Paul's, this basilica was one of Constantine's creations. From the 4th through the early 14th century, it was the home and residence of all the popes. We will end our day with a visit to the Basilica of St. Mary Major, one of the four major basilicas built by Pope Sixtus III in the 5th century. It is especially noted for the Roman mosaics in its nave, depicting scenes from the Old Testament. Independent lunch and afternoon at leisure. Dinner and overnight at hotel in Rome. (B,D)

Day 6 January 7, Wednesday: AM/Papal Audience - PM/Tour of the Vatican Museum & Sistine Chapel

Early morning, walk to St. Peter's Basilica to **celebrate Mass at the Tomb of St. Peter.** Return to hotel for breakfast. After breakfast, **walk into the heart of Christendom for an audience with our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI.** Our pilgrimage will be acknowledged during the English language portion. Independent lunch. After lunch, continue our day with a visit to one of the great art collections in the world, the Vatican Museums. Walk in the footsteps of the Princes of the Church through the richly decorated galleries. Visit the famous Pinacoteca (Picture Gallery), which houses religious works by Giotto, Raphael, Da Vinci, Caravaggio and Rodin, among others. Continue on to the Sistine Chapel, the private chapel of the Popes, where Michelangelo best expressed his genius in monumental frescoes. End your tour in St. Peter's to see Michelangelo's magnificent "Pieta." Take in the awesome architecture & the statuary adorning this largest of all Christian churches.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Rome. (B,D)

Day 7 January 8, Thursday: Montecassino-San Giovanni Rotondo

After breakfast leave for San Giovanni Rotondo, en-route we visit the 5th century Abbey of Montecassino, the cradle of the Benedictine Order. The monastery of Montecassino, the motherhouse of the Benedictines, was founded by St. Benedict in 529. Stop for independent lunch en-route. Upon arrival in San Giovanni Rotondo, we visit the Basilica of Our Lady of Grace. **Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of Our Lady of Grace.** Dinner and overnight at hotel in San Giovanni Rotondo. (B,D)

Day 8 January 9, Friday: San Giovanni Rotondo - Naples - Evening/Ferry Sailing to Palermo

After breakfast, we visit the Basilica of Our Lady of Grace, where we will **celebrate Mass at the tomb of Padre Pio.** After Mass, we visit Padre Pio's cell, the old church where he received the stigmata, his confessional and the new Church of Our Lady of Grace. Time will be given for prayer and reflection. Then, we leave San Giovanni Rotondo for Naples. Stop for independent lunch enroute. Upon arrival in Naples, you will have a panoramic tour of Naples. Naples is situated on a beautiful bay on the Mediterranean coast. Enjoy your panoramic ride of the city: Mergellina, Castel dell'Ovo, Plebiscito Square, The Royal Palace, and the Maschio Angioino with its triumphal arch and deep moats. Enjoy and photograph with the famous view of the city, the bay and Mt. Vesuvius. If time permits we will visit the Cathedral (Duomo di San Gennaro), the blood miracle of St. Januarius. Later this afternoon, we continue to Naples Pier for your 6:30pm check-in. At 8:30pm, depart on your overnight Ferry sailing to Palermo. Independent dinner. Overnight on board ferry in outside cabins. (B,D)

Day 9 January 10, Saturday: Palermo - Erice - Trapani

Around 7:00am, arrive at Palermo Pier. Stop for independent continental breakfast at a coffee shop. Upon arrival this morning, you will get acquainted with Palermo, a city of wide boulevards, old quarters, town houses, harmonious squares, baroque palaces, and modern buildings. 1,800-foot Monte Pellegrino borders Palermo on the north. Begin our tour at the Palazzo dei Normanni, the splendid Norman royal palace. Inside are the Cappella Palatina, and La Sala di Re Ruggiero, glittering chambers encrusted with mosaics of eastern influence. Then we visit Chiesa Di San Giovanni Degli Eremiti. Following Corso Vittorio Emmanuele, the city's oldest thoroughfare, we head to the Quattro Canti, sometimes called Piazza Vigliena; this four-cornered crossroad is the heart of the Old City. Here, Sicily's baroque soul dominates in the four monuments decorated with fountains and statues. End our tour at the Convento Dei Cappuccini. The catacombs of this ancient convent are an amazing sight, containing the desiccated bodies, of more than 8,000 priests, professionals, workers, women, and children of Old Palermo. **Celebrate Mass at the Shrine of Santa Rosalia,** greatly venerated at Palermo and in the whole of Sicily. Independent lunch. This afternoon, we continue to Erice, located at the summit of Monte San Giuliano. You will be enthralled with the changing countryside, from the spectacular green mountains, to barren regions, ancient ruins, citrus trees, olive groves, vineyards, and the mosaic-like tapestry of the farmed landscape. Arrive in Erice through the Porta Trapani, one of three Norman town-gates. Visit the Chiesa Matrice, dedicated to Our Lady of the Assumption. Stroll along the cobblestone streets of this quaint medieval city, with its narrow winding lanes, and delightful small shops selling ceramics, Sicilian salt, candies, marzipan, Marsala wine and other specialty items. Continue to the medieval coastal city of Trapani. Dinner and overnight at hotel in Trapani. (D)

Day 10 January 11, Sunday: Trapani-Marsala - Alcamo -Palermo

Following a buffet breakfast at the hotel you will enjoy a beautiful panoramic city tour of Trapani. Ancient legends tell of mythical origins for the city. Continue on to Marsala along the Salt Road and see numerous dazzlingly white mountains, actually hills of salt, shimmering in the sun. Some of these mounds are topped by a series of recently restored windmills that recall the days when they were among the main instruments for pumping the water and grinding the salt. Salt is one of the Sicilian economy's historical resources. Arrive in the seaport city of Marsala, known for its history, coastline and Sicily's most famous wine. Following our morning tour of Marsala, we head inland for Alcamo. Upon arrival in Alcamo we will **celebrate the closing Mass of our pilgrimage at Our Lady of Miracles.** The image of Our Lady of Miracles was discovered in 1547, and is associated with many miracles. A Church was built where the image was found, and since that time has been the glory of Alcamo. In 1936 a Mission Chapel was built in Canarsie, Brooklyn with the title "Our Lady of Miracles." Devotion to our Blessed Mother continues to grow in both of these places, even to this day. Following Mass, time will

be given for prayer and reflection at this beautiful church. Independent lunch in Alcamo. We continue on to Palermo, with a brief stop in Corleone enroute. Dinner and overnight at hotel in Palermo. (B,D)

Day 11 January 12, Monday: Return to the USA

This morning, you will be transferred to Palermo Airport for your return flight to the USA via Rome's Leonardo Da Vinci Airport.

PAYMENT: Deposits and insurance payments will be accepted in the form of check or money order only. In an effort to keep our prices as low as possible, it is recommended that all payments be made via check or money order. However, it is possible to make your final payment via MasterCard, Discover, or American Express. A convenience fee of \$100.00 will apply to your account. Invoices and credit card authorization forms will be included with your welcome document. The credit card form must be completed in entirety in order for the transaction to be approved. Passages reserves the right to increase package rate or reduce services accordingly should there be an escalation in the Euro valuation over the US dollar in excess of 10% from print date. If for any reason payment is received within 21 days of departure, a charge for express mailing of final documents will be required.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round trip from New York via Alitalia Airlines. Flight itinerary and carrier may be subject to change. Airfare is subject to increases prior to date of travel. By sending your deposit together with your completed reservation form before the deposit deadline, airfare will be guaranteed against future fare increases excluding tax increases or fuel surcharges. Tax and fuel surcharge estimation is based on increases imposed by airlines is subject to increase prior to ticketing (approximately 30 days prior to departure). (see LATE RESERVATIONS) Airlines will provide a block of seats for the group. Individual requests for seating preferences can be made at time of check-in only. If you are a member of the frequent flyer or affiliate program, please bring your account card to the airport on the day of departure to receive proper mileage credit. Passages cannot submit seating preferences or frequent flyer information as we cannot guarantee that any or all requests will be honored.

ACCOMMODATIONS/SINGLE TRAVELERS: Price per person is based on two persons sharing twin bedded rooms with private facilities in hotels throughout your tour. Triple Rooms are available for family or friends traveling together. We discourage triple room accommodations because they are normally not spacious and there is no discount for triple occupancy. Triple rooms usually are regular twin or double-bedded rooms with a cot or rollaway bed added. Single Rooms are limited but may be requested at time of booking for an additional charge of \$595.00. While single rooms provide privacy, they are often smaller than twin rooms and are sometimes located away from the group in a different area of the hotel, and may be in high traffic areas, such as stairways/elevators. We honestly do not like to assess an additional charge for the single traveler and will make every effort (if you so desire) to match you with a same gender roommate when we receive your application, but we do not guarantee a roommate can be matched. If a single room must be assigned due to your roommate's cancelling, incompatibility or for any other reason (even at the last moment or while on tour), we must charge you the tour's single supplement or pro-rated amount

MEALS: Breakfast daily plus eight (8) dinners as per itinerary. Beverages (coffee, tea, mineral water) are not included at set menu dinners.

SIGHTSEEING AND ENTRANCE FEES: All sightseeing as per itinerary aboard a private motorcoach with the services of a professional, licensed, English-speaking guide. Entrance fees to all sights are included.

BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE: Due to bus space, one carry-on bag and one checked bag per person are permitted. Standard airline baggage policies usually allow checked baggage up to 62 total inches and range to 50 pounds and carry-on baggage up to 45 total inches and 15 to 40 pounds. However, policies may vary from the time of printing of this brochure. Contact your airline directly before departure for current baggage dimension allowances. For luggage exceeding the allowed limits, excess baggage fees will apply at check-in. Our final documents will contain current information applicable to your designated airline.

TRANSFER AND PORTERAGE: Round trip private transfers from/to Hotel. Porterage of one piece of luggage throughout your tour at hotels. Although the Airlines will allow you to check two pieces of luggage, we strongly suggest that you travel with one suitcase and one carry-on.

SERVICE CHARGES FOR ITINERARY CHANGES: Passages is pleased to assist clients with changes in itineraries (All deviation requests must be submitted in writing at least 90 days prior to departure). Deviation fee will apply plus an airline change fee per person. Your routing and dates requested will determine if a difference in airfare will also apply. Not all carriers permit routing changes and/or deviations from the group itinerary. Please contact our office for detailed information.

LATE RESERVATIONS: A \$25.00 fee and possible increase in airfare may apply for bookings received after the deposit deadline. All space is subject to availability. Special delivery charges incurred will also be due in advance.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS: From the time your deposit is received up to 130 days prior to departure, there is a \$200.00 nonrefundable cancellation fee per person. TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: All participants must have a valid passport. **US Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months, subsequent to return date.** Special entry requirements for non-U.S. citizens may apply. Please consult the appropriate Consulate for current requirements. It is solely the passenger's responsibility to ensure that all documents needed are completed and current. Passages will not be held responsible for lack of current and valid entry documents.

SERVICE CHARGES: All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the program rate. Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave Euro 1.00 per person for the waiters after each meal; Euro 1.00 per person per day for the Maid/Bell Boys.

TIPPING: For good work, recommended (but voluntary) tipping to your driver is Euro 2.00 per passenger per day; to the Tour Manager/escort Euro 3.00 per passenger per day, for the local guides Euro 1.00 per passenger per day. Tips for the bus driver and Tour Manager/escort are normally given as a group at the end of the tour. Other gratuities are usually handled individually.

TRAVELER HEALTH ADVISORY: All passengers must ensure that they are medically and physically fit for travel and that such traveling will not endanger themselves or others as Pilgrimages entail a lot of walking, climbing up/down stairs, etc. Any passenger who is physically challenged must submit a certificate from his/her medical doctor stating that he/she is capable of taking part in this pilgrimage without assistance. If special assistance is required, the passenger must travel with a companion willing and capable of providing any necessary assistance.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: It is strongly recommended that all participants buy insurance when they travel since the tour operator is not responsible for lost or damaged luggage or trip interruption. Passages offers an optional comprehensive Passenger Travel Protection Insurance Policy. These benefits and services help insure the well being of the passenger while traveling worldwide. The insurance premiums are based on total package price, including single supplements, deviation fees, late charges, etc. The premium for total package prices from \$2,101.00 to \$3,000.00 is \$175.00; from \$3,001.00 and over is \$199.00. **If the insurance payment is made at the time of deposit or within 10 days of receiving the Passages "Tour Deposit Acknowledgment Letter," the passenger will be covered for pre-existing conditions.
